School is a place where children come to learn how to emotionally regulate and how to build friendships. To help all of our children do this we need to have a clear response to unwanted behaviour. When this occurs, all adults will follow the behaviour poster below. These are seen on the playground and in every classroom. In every instant, children will be given time to reflect (thinking time) and make a positive change. All red or grey zone behaviour

will mean a parent will be spoken to. At this point the consequence for those behaviours will be explained.

The added clarity around what is expected of the children is already having a positive impact and I am pleased to say the children have been amazing. I am currently updating the behaviour policy and will be in communication with you all once I have it published.
